Chop Saw Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

Do not use the saw if there is a part mounted! Ask the PIT crew about the machine status.

Starting the saw:

- 1. Wear correct PPE: Safety glasses and hearing protection (i.e., ear muffs or ear plugs).
- 2. Perform a visual inspection of the machine. Make sure all components are set tight. Especially check blade guard for any damage and correct function.
- 3. **Unplug the saw to prevent accidentally starting it.** Rotating by hand, check the blade for damage or material jammed in the teeth.
- 4. Report damages or loose parts to the PIT crew immediately, do <u>not</u> start the saw. If there is no damage, plug the saw back in.
- 5. Unlock the chop arm by pulling the locking pin.
- 6. Set up your work piece, use C-clamps when possible. Demo your operations to check for feasibility.
- 7. Connect the Shop Vacuum to the vacuum port and turn it on.
- 8. Make your cuts.

Working with the chop saw:

- 1. Always double check your set-up in between steps.
- 2. <u>Never</u> leave tools or cut-offs in the chop saw.
- 3. There should always be at least 5 inches of clearance between your hands and the blade.
- 4. If you need to pause your job, depress the chop arm and lock it and then turn off the vacuum.
- 5. When resuming your job, check your set-up again.

Shutting down the chop saw:

- 1. Depress the chop arm and lock it.
- 2. Clean the saw and store away fixtures. Disconnect and store away the vacuum.
- 3. Put left over material in the trash or material storage area or take it with you.
- 4. Sweep the saw area shop floor.
- 5. Let the PIT crew know when you are done.
