## **South Bend Lathe Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)**

# Do not use the machine if there is a part inside! Ask the PIT crew about the machine status.

#### Starting the lathe:

- 1. Wear correct **PPE**: Safety glasses and hearing protection (i.e., ear muffs or ear plugs)
- 2. Confirm that the chuck clamping is set tight, check that jaws do not extend from the chuck, perform a visual inspection of the machine, and make sure all components are set tight.
- 3. Report any damages or loose parts to the PIT crew immediately. Do <u>not</u> start the machine if there are damages or loose parts
- 4. Set up your work piece and tools, rotate chuck by hand and demo your operations to check for collisions, change your setup if needed.
- 5. Start the machine.

# Working with the lathe:

- 1. Always double check your set-up.
- 2. Never leave the chuck key in the chuck.
- 3. If you need to pause your job, hit the e-stop.
- 4. When resuming your job, check your set-up again.

## Shutting down the lathe:

- 1. Hit the e-stop.
- 2. Clean the tools and put them away, clean shavings from the lathe post, slides and bed and wipe off oil and coolant.
- 3. Put larger amounts of shavings in the proper shavings bucket.
- 4. Remove your work piece. Put residual materials in the material storage cart.
- 5. Clean and organize the tool cart
- 6. Sweep the lathe area shop floor.
- 7. Let the PIT crew know when you are done.
